

## Warty Armpit Growth

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A six-year-old male presents with a warty growth in his armpit which was present as a flatter lesion at birth. It is asymptomatic and he is otherwise healthy.

## What is your diagnosis?

A linear epidermal nevus is a congenital hamartoma that arises in early childhood. It can present on the trunk, neck, or extremities and appears in a linear formation. It often begins flat and then develops a raised, warty proliferation of the epidermis. This lesion can be classified Figure 1. Warty armpit growth. into:

- localized (most common),
- systemic (epidermal nevus syndrome), or remove these lesions; more superficial treatinflammatory (inflammatory linear vertucous ments will result in recurrence. Occasionally, epidermal nevus).
  The histology shows papillomatosis and acanor laser ablation are employed.

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
